## Requirements of PDP Data Submission for FirstGen Forward

- First data submission is due the following August after you join as a Network Leader and includes 3-5 years of historical data.
- After your first year, a yearly data submission is due in August.
- Approximately 40 hours of work time are required for your data submission each year.
- Required data elements can be found in the National Student Clearinghouse's <u>PDP</u> <u>Knowledge Base</u>.

The PDP stands apart from other national data sources because it captures more detailed student-level information. For institutions, this means:

- Access to disaggregated data by demographics, enrollment status, academic performance, and more.
- Flexible metrics such as momentum measures, gateway course completion, and early progress indicators.
- More frequent updates that support timely decision-making, equity analysis, and student success efforts.
